All unregistered animals must be entered and show as crossbreed. Shorthorns must be 15/16 or higher. Simmentals must be 1/2 or higher. No appendix animals will be shown in breed classes.
- 4. All Breed exhibitors must enter registration number on entry form. All breed exhibits must present registration documents and animal to the "Registered Beef Check-in" location on Sunday between 10 am 12:30 pm. Animal must correspond to description, tattoo and ownership as shown by registration and transfer certificates. Failure to comply forfeits all rights to show and/or award.
- Exhibitor number cards must be displayed on the back of the exhibitor in the showring.
- Bedding must be straw or pine shavings only. All beef cattle must have a neck strap or rope chain in addition to a halter.

- Fairgrounds to be able to show. There will be NO exception to this rule.
- Bred heifers are not eligible for show as Market Beef Heifers. 1st and 2nd
 place class winners will be pregnancy checked after the show. If heifer is
 found to be pregnant, exhibitor will forfeit placing, premium and right to
 sell.
- All class winners will compete in championship drive (no separate champion for heifer). Grand and Reserve Market beef are required to sell and are terminal (steer or heifer)

Market Beef Steer/Heifers shall be shown by weight with a maximum of 10 per class. Market heifer class will show as a class provided (5) eligible heifers are weighed. Otherwise, they will show by weight with the steers. Exhibitor's number cards must be worn in the show ring on the back of exhibitor.

MARKET BEEF STEER/HEIFER WEIGH IN RULES

Market Beef Steer/Heifer will be weighed for show classification on Sunday, August 8th at West end of Grubb Arena. Order of weigh-in begins at 1 PM with dairy feeders followed by beef market steers.





STEER POOL GENERAL RULES

- 1. Open to participants living in or attending school in the Hartford Fair District. A member must be at least 9 years old by January 1 of current year or have completed the third grade and must not have passed their 19th birthday by January 1 of current year
- 2. The plan for the selection of the steers for the Steer Pool is as follows: The 2021 participants, who meets age and residence requirements and completed the 2021 show, are eligible for the 2022 lottery system. Each individual is to be present to select their calf. Those unable to attend will have their calves chosen by the Steer Pool Committee after all of those present have selected. No one will be permitted to. view the calves any time prior to selection. Anyone violating this procedure relinquishes his or her right to draw forselection.
- All participants must exhibit their steer in the Junior Fair at the Hartford Fair in the Steer Pool Show, Steer Pool Sale, and the Carcass Show provided for this steer class.
- All participants are expected to personally feed, manage, and keep records on their 7. steer. No wet steers will be weighed.
- All participants must start feed records when the steer is obtained and will end the record keeping on July 31st. Record books and all other required forms are to be turned in at the Skillathon.
- Each exhibitor is expected to take entire charge of his/her livestock after arriving at the fair. The exhibitor may receive assistance from the following eligible persons: Hartford9. Fair District 4-H advisors, and/or FFA advisors, Steer Pool advisors, immediate family member and other Hartford Fair junior fair exhibitors. All exhibitors must use a designated area to prep steers. All clipping/grooming is to be performed in the designated area only.
- 7. 1st & 2nd place steers in each class are eligible for Champion & Reserve Champion steer 11. Exhibitors must show their animal unless the Steer Pool Committee gives placing. 1st thru 5th are eligible for special premiums.
- Any feed or feeding program may be used with the exception of milk in any form.
- 9. Two percent to be deducted from sale price. Slaughter cost to be absorbed by the buyer of all Steer Pool Animals. Hauling cost will be deducted from all Steer Pool
- 10. Steer Pool committee will rule on eligibility of a member not completing the program from the previous year.
- 11. The number of contestants will be limited at a max. of 65.
- 12. Beddingmustbestraw orpineshavings only. All steer must have a neck strap or rope chain in addition to a halter when tied.
- Exhibitors are required to attend 3 of the 5 informational meetings, participate in the. Steer Pool Skillathon or all premiums will be withheld. All of the above items listed. must be done for the participant to be considered a completer of the program.
- 14. Observation and completion of rules 1-13, and a completer of the program, as determined by the Steer Pool Committee are eligible to participate in the Steer Pool Program the following year.
- 15. Should an extenuating circumstance arise that makes things impossible to complete the above requirements, it may be brought to the committee for further consideration, and the decision will be up to the Steer Pool Committee's decision provided that there are at least 5 members in attendance.
- 16. All trailers left on the fairground during fair week must be parked in designated parking areas.
- 17. In the event of an extenuating circumstances and the steer needs to be sold prior to the fair, the committee must be notified in advance of the sale of that steer.
- 18. In the untimely event of the death of the steer, you are required to notify the committee immediately upon death.
- The barn meeting will be held on Saturday, August 8th at 6pm with weigh-ins to immediately follow.

- 1. The judge of the show will be the judge approved by the Hartford Fair Board. Animals will be placed by 1, 2, 3 etc. for position and will be given grades of A or B for premium payment. An award will be given to the exhibitor who exhibits the steer that gained the most using the purchase weight and sale weight to give the gain.
- All steers exhibited in class 105-JA must have been purchased through the Licking County Jr Fair Steer Pool.
- Exhibitor must show in the live show in order to sell their animal.
 - The steers will be divided into a maximum of (5) five weight classes set up at the time of weighing in order to have nearly even numbers in each class.
 - Exhibitor number cards will be issued at the Steer Pool Skillathon sign in. The exhibitor number card must be displayed on the back of the exhibitor in the show
 - Stall cards will be put up based on the assignments decided upon the Steer Pool Committee. It will be necessary for those not showing to let the committee know the Saturday before the show.
 - The judge will determine which steers show for Champion, Reserve Champion and top 5 places. Any fraud, tampering or alterations to animals will be dealt with according to the Ohio Department of Ag.Rules.
 - All clipping/grooming is to be done outside of the barn in the assigned area. While grooming there is to be no use of Steer Pool barn electricity, if you need an electrical source you must provide yourown.
- 10. The steers in this show are barred from other competition unless approved by the Steer PoolCommittee
- permission otherwise. Failure to notify the committee by Saturday before the Fair will result in automatic expulsion from the Steer Pool in future years.
- 12. Plaques will be awarded to the exhibitor of the Champion and Reserve Champion of this department. Special premiums will be paid for 1st through 5th place overall
