- AN EXHIBITOR MAY ENTER AS MANY CLASSES AS THEY WISH, BUT ONLY 1 ENTRY PER LOT PER EXHIBITOR. **EXCEPTION OF "BABY QUILT CONTEST AND CROCHET/KNITING CONTEST FOR BABIES. AN EXHIBITOR MAY ENTER ONE ITEM, BUT DONATE ADDITIONAL ITEMS.**
- 3. DEPT 10. THRU 19 IS PRE-ENTRY ONLY. EXHIBITORS MUST COMPLETE AN ONLINE ENTRY FORM BY 11:59 PM EST, SATURDAY, JUNE 26TH.
- 4. THE COMMITTEE HAS THE RIGHT TO REFUSE ANY ENTRY NOT CLEAN OR SUITABLE FOR CLASS.
- 5. ALL ITEMS ENTERED MUST BE EXHIBITORS OWN WORK AND NOT DISPLAYED AT THE HARTFORD INDEPENDENT FAIR IN THE LAST 2 CALENDAR YEARS.
