### JUNIOR FAIR DAIRY FEEDER STEER SHOWMANSHIP

<b>LOT</b>	<b>DESCRIPTION</b>
1	Beginner Ages 8-9
2	Junior Ages 9-11
3	Intermediate Ages 12-14
4	Senior Ages 15-19
5	Expert (Previous Senior/Expert Winners)

1. See Junior Fair rules published at the beginning of the Junior Fair section of this book.
2. Dairy Feeders Steers must attend pre-fair tagging on Saturday, June 7<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 am – 12:00 pm at Grubb Arena – West end on the Hartford Fairgrounds. A mandatory vaccination program will be in place, with the total cost per calf being set at \$10.
3. All Dairy Feeders Steers must have a neck strap or rope/chain in addition to a halter while tied.
4. Bedding must be straw or pine shavings only. **NO** floor fans are allowed.
5. Animals must be of 100% dairy bloodlines. Holstein or Brown Swiss only.
6. Must be born after January 1<sup>st</sup> of the exhibition year.
7. Animals must be dehorned and castrated before tagging.
8. Exhibitors must own and care for their calf as of May 1<sup>st</sup>.
9. There is a limit of four (4) steers entered by any one (1) exhibitor. The weight range will be 400 – 650 pounds. Steers weighing 399 pounds or under **will not** sell. Steers weighing 651 pounds and over will sell. Under/Overweight steers may show for class grade only (no Championship or Rate of Gain Awards).
10. All Dairy Feeder Steers will be stalled in the designated Dairy Feeder area of Kohman Wing of Grubb Arena.
11. No fans in the Kohman wing except for fans installed by the Fair Board.
12. The barn closes at 11:00 pm every night.

Only one **(1)** Market Steer project is allowed to be sold at the Hartford Fair Livestock sale. Ex: one **(1)** Steer Pool (**must sell**) or one **(1)** Dairy Feeder or one **(1)** 4-H Steer.

Dairy Feeder Steers will be weighed for show classification on Sunday, August 3<sup>rd</sup> at 1:00 pm in the NW Kohman Wing of Grubb Arena. The show weight is also the official sale weight. All steers will be shown by weight classes.

Each exhibitor is expected to take entire charge of the care of his/her cattle after arriving at the fair. The exhibitor may receive assistance from the following eligible people: Hartford Fair District 4-H Advisors and/or FFA Advisors, Steer Pool Advisors, immediate family members, and other Hartford Fair Junior Fair exhibitors. Any fraud, tampering, or alteration of animals will be dealt with according to the Ohio Department of Agriculture Rules. Violations will result in the immediate removal of the animal from the fairgrounds and forfeiture of all rights to show/sell and/or awards (s).

All showmanship participants **MUST** sign up in the Fair Entry process. Dairy Feeder Steer showmanship will be held on Wednesday at 8:30 am. Classes will be broken to have no more than 12 exhibitors in any class (i.e., if eighteen Junior exhibitors register, two **(2)** classes will be held with the Judge picking the Top three **(3)** in each class to bring back to show for the class division winner). The show schedule will be Senior (ages 15-19), Intermediate (ages 12-14), Junior (ages 9-11), Beginners (ages 8 -9), and Expert. Immediately following Expert Showmanship, the Expert winner will compete against other beef Expert Showmanship winners to determine the Super Showmanship participant. Animals will show un-groomed. Please see the official rules for Expert/Super Showmanship posted at the beginning of the Junior Fair section in the Fair Book.

Rosettes will be awarded for all divisions: Beginner Showmanship \* Junior Showmanship (9-11) \* Intermediate Showmanship (12-14) \* Senior Showmanship (15-18)\*, and Expert Showmanship.

Old Timers Showmanship will follow the Dairy Show. The previous two **(2)** years' winners are ineligible.

A Rate of Gain award will be presented to the exhibitor with the Dairy Feeder Steer gaining the most weight between June and August weigh-ins.

The Junior exhibitor who shows the most tender loving care to his/her livestock project will receive an award.

The Dairy Herdsman award will be judged on the following:

1. Cleanliness and neatness of the General Exhibit area (feed, trunk, aisle, etc.)
2. Care of animals (cleaned and well groomed).
3. Cooperating with others (Fair officials, other exhibitors, and fair visitors).
4. Effort put forth by an individual.
5. Previous year's winners are ineligible.
