- 1. Entries close Friday, June 27th, at midnight
- 2. Entry must be made whether a single animal or a group.
- 3. Entry fee is \$3.00 per lot/entry whether a single entry of one (1) animal or a group.
- 4. Posted stall assignments are **final**. There will be **NO** changes. Bedding must be straw or pine shaving. **NO** floor fans are allowed
- 5. Tach is not to be stored in the pens. The Hartford Fair Board reserves the right to remove any tack from pens not being used to stall animals.
- 6. Check the health regulations printed in this tabloid.
- 7. All bedding MUST be removed from the pens before leaving.

- 8. Each breed must have a minimum of five (5) animals and three (3) families exhibiting or the following year the class will be re-evaluated by the fair board for inclusion.
- 9. Breeder's Flock of Five consists of a ram (yearling or ram lamb), 2 yearling ewes, & 2 ewe lambs
- 10. The exhibitor must own all sheep.
- 11. Center dividers must remain in and fastened to the back of the pen if taken down. Cannot remove two (2) consecutive center dividers. The Hartford Fair Board reserves the right to put dividers back.
- 12. Open Class sheep are permitted to be hauled in Friday, shown, and taken home. Only those hauled in on Friday can be taken home on Friday.
- 13. The barn closes at 11:00 pm every night.
- 14. Hartford Fair Cash Premium: All Open Class premiums, except for Goat, Llama, and exhibits located in the Arts/Crafts building, will be paid cash premiums at the Hartford Fair Bank. Any premium not picked up by the fair's last day will be forfeited.
- 15. Old Timers' judging will be strictly on the showmanship of the individual and not the animal. The showman does not have to own the animal being shown.

All intact breeding animals entered in the Hartford Fair for the purpose of participating in the Sheep Breeding Class shows must follow the guidelines as listed below:

- All intact breeding animals must be identified with official USDA-approved identification (USDA-approved tags, USDA-approved tattoos, or identification in the Scrapie Flock Certification Program).
 - a. All registered animals with accompanying registration tattoos would be acceptable once flock is registered with USDA (registration tags are not acceptable).
 - b. If the breeding animal was purchased outside of Ohio, the animal must have official USDA identification as well as a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) signed by both the Veterinarian and the exhibitor within 30 days of the opening of the Hartford Fair. (CVA must attest to the following: "The sheep in this shipment are not known to be under any movement restrictions because of scrapies.")

OPEN CLASS WOOL/FLEECE

Open Class wool/fleece must be in place no later than 8:00 am, Thursday.

- 1. Fleeces shall not be more than 12 months growth.
- 2. Each exhibitor will be limited to two (2) fleeces.
- 3. All fleeces must have been sheared from sheep owned by the exhibitor.
- 4. There will be three (3) Divisions Course, Medium, and Fine Wool. Each division will have 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place. There will be one (1) Supreme Fleece.
- 5. Fleeces will be shown in clear plastic bags, rolled with flash side out in a manner to allow their being handled without falling apart.
- 6. Judging of fleece shall be considered.
 - a. Fitness
 - b. Evenness of quality or fitness among the various parts of the fleece
 - c. Length and strength of staple
 - d. Estimated clean weight.
 - e. Condition
 - f. Character, including crimp and color.



- 7. Plaques will be awarded to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners in both Junior and Senior Divisions. Cash will be awarded in the amounts of \$20, \$15, and \$10.
