Only Female & Wether Animals are allowed. No horned goats or horn scurs over three (3) inches long in dairy classes. No kids under 30 days old are allowed due to the State of Ohio Regulations. No Bucklings Allowed. No stalling for animals not entered in the Junior Fair.

- 1. All goats exhibited must have official USDA scrapic identification, including market wethers to show or sell at the fair.
- 2. Tents are prohibited around the barn except for the express purpose of grooming or fitting on show days. They may be set up in a pre-designated area of the trailer lot to the east of the goat barn.
- Three sides of the goat pens must allow airflow to pass through (maybe covered with lattice, chicken wire, livestock
 panel, etc., no plywood with drilled holes). Boards must not extend above the gates. 18" or shorter kickboards are
 allowed on all sides.
- 4. Gates in goat pens must stay in pens. Center dividers must be fastened to the back of the pen if taken down. Cannot remove 2 consecutive center dividers. The Hartford Fair Board reserves the right to put dividers back.
- 5. Solid tarps may not be hung from the barn. Sunshades or mesh tarps are allowed at the discretion of the Hartford Senior Fair Board.
- 6. **NO** use of barn electric for personal fans, crockpots, and other appliances unless directly for the benefit of the livestock. Blowers must be run on generators.
- 7. Bedding must be either straw or pine shavings.
- 8. **NO** use of muzzles.
- 9. All goats must stay in the barn area during fair week.

- a. No goats in the horse trailer parking lot south of the barn, campgrounds, or natural resource area.
- b. Goats may be exercised on the gravel driveway.
- c. Only goats hauled in for the Open Show are allowed inside the livestock trailer parking area.
- 10. A goat may only be entered in one class, with the exception of being entered in showmanship as well.
- 11. The same goat must be shown for all heats of Showmanship & Super Showmanship.
- 12. Dairy Goats entered in Classes JA, JB, JC, or JD, Lots 4-7, may be hauled in the day of the show as long as they are in milk.
- 13. All goat shows, junior and open, will be subject to Ohio Livestock Health Exhibition Rules and Ohio Livestock Tampering Exhibition Rules that are listed on our website. The rules include, but are not limited to:
 - a. Unacceptable Practices
 - i. Using ice, ice packs, cold packs, or cold compresses internally or externally unless prescribed by the fair veterinarian.
 - ii. Drenching of livestock at an exhibition is prohibited except as prescribed and done under the supervision of the fair Veterinarian.
 - iii. Using any substance to enhance or change the color of the livestock, including the livestock's hide or hooves. Adding any substance eternally to build up, change, or alter the livestock, including, by way of example, but not limited to rope, false hair, graphite, hemp, and powders. This Includes powders, powdered paints, and paint, per state veterinarian.
 - b. Prohibited grooming practices:
 - . Using any substance to enhance or change the color of the livestock, including the livestock's hide. Hooves. Adding any substance externally to build up, change, or alter the shape or conformation of the livestock, including, by way of example, but not limited to rope, false hair, graphite, hemp, and other powers. This includes powders, powdered paints, and paint, per the state veterinarian.
- 14. The barn closes at 11:00 pm every night.

MARKET GOAT RULES

- Market Goats must weigh a minimum of 45 pounds to show for a Champion and sell. Only goats weighing 42-44
 pounds are eligible for a re-weigh.
- 2. Grand and Reserve Champion Market Goat must go to slaughter and will be subject to drug testing.
- 3. Market Goats must be slick shorn above the hock and knee no more than 10 days before the fair.
- 4. All Market Goats must have intact milk teeth at the time of weigh-in.

DAIRY GOAT

(Age based on the goat's age as of the day of the show).

Any doe that has ever freshened shall compete only in the milking classes, even though dry at the time of showing.

MARKET GOAT SHOW FORMAT

Market Goats will be divided into three (3) divisions of five (5) weight classes each.

First and second from each weight class will advance to their respective division champion drive.

Each division champion drive will place a Top 5 (Champion, Reserve Champion, third, fourth, and fifth).

The top 5 from each division will come back for the final drive where the Supreme Champions and a Top 10 will be selected.

MARKET GOAT RATE OF GAIN

Market animals will be weighed on the 3rd Saturday in May during tagging. They will be re-weighed on the Sunday fair begins at the barn. The animals with the top two (2) gains will be declared Champion and Reserve Champion Rate of Gain.

MARKET GOAT TAGGING

All market goats must be tagged. Each exhibitor may tag up to six (6) market goats, but no more than two (2) may be exhibited, and only one (1) may sell. The goats being tagged MUST be designated to a particular exhibitor. This will be done the **THIRD SATURDAY IN MAY** at the goat barn on the fairgrounds from 10:00 am - 12:00 pm. There will be a \$2.00 charge per animal.

GOAT USDA IDENTIFICATION PROGRAM

All goats entered in the Hartford Fair for the purpose of participating in the goat show and/or sale must have official USDA-approved identification (USDA-approved tags, USDA-approved tattoos, or identification in the Scrapie Flock Certification Program) indicating the flock of birth. Identification must be provided by the owner on record at the time of birth. No goat will be permitted to show or sell during the Hartford Fair without such identification. Doe kids entered in the market goat show, as well as all wethers, which were purchased outside of Ohio, are required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) signed by both the veterinarian and the exhibitor within 30 days of the opening of the Hartford Fair. (CVI) must attest to the following: "the goats in this shipment are not known to be under any movement restrictions because of scrapie.")

MARKET GOAT BRED & OWN

- 1. B & O animals will be designated at the time of tagging by a different fair tag and a USDA scrapie ID
- 2. Animals without official scrapies ID at the time of tagging are not eligible for B & O
- 3. Exhibitor must be able to prove the scrapies premises ID belongs to themselves, sibling, parent, stepparent, or grandparent upon request. Exhibitors, or family members (as designated in the General rules), must have ownership of the dam at the time of breeding (may not purchase a bred doe). Embryo transplants are only permitted if the embryo came from a doe that was owned by the exhibitor or a family member at the time of breeding.

The Junior exhibitor who shows the most tender loving care of his or her livestock project will receive a plaque.

All participants MUST sign up in the Fair Entry process for showmanship classes.

The current year winner of the Expert Meat Goat Showmanship Contest will compete against the current year winners of the Expert Dairy Goat Showmanship and Expert pygmy Goat Showmanship classes to determine who will represent the Goat Division in the Super Showmanship Contest. Please see the official rules for Expert/Super Showmanship, posted at the beginning of the Junior Fair section in the Fair Book.

All white attire is strongly recommended for all Dairy Goat exhibitors.
